SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. To be eligible for the allowance the parent/guardian must hold a Centrelink or Veterans' Affairs card that represents a statement of income for the family.

The allowance consists of two components:

- \$115 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian of the student or paid to the school to cover charges.
- \$235 Educational Program Allowance paid directly to the school.
- Application is made by the parent or guardian for students in Years 7 – 12

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

➤ Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Centrelink Family Health Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card

PLEASE NOTE: *The only Veterans' Affairs Card that meets the criteria is a blue card that is issued each year and expires in December each year. This card is income means tested.*

➤ Parent/guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. The *only* exception to this is when a student holds their own health care card *and has been declared independent by Centrelink*. In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

➤ The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age.
