- 7.5 Youthcare Funding Request J Pilkington provided additional information and explanation of the funding request we received from Youthcare. - 7.6 Interschool Athletics Carnival Wagin DHS will be hosting the 2018 Interschool Athletics Carnival on 27th October at the Wagin Sportground. T Spooner asked that all P&C members show their full support of this day as we will need alot of assistance with the catering.
