Swimming Carnival

The Faction swimming carnival will be held this Friday at the Wagin Memorial Swimming Pool. Thank you to all the parents who have volunteered their time to support our school event.

Want to know about the OLNA?

Some students in Years 10, 11 and 12 are about to sit the OLNA. You may have heard about it, but are not sure what it means for your child.

OLNA stands for the Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessment. In order to demonstrate the required literacy and numeracy standards for the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE), some students are expected to sit this assessment. The School Curriculum and Standards Authority (Authority) awards the WACE at the end of Year 12 to students who have met all the requirements. You can find more about the requirements on the Authority website at www.scsa.wa.edu.au

Some students prequalify for the literacy and numeracy requirement through their performance in the Year 9 NAPLAN test. We will inform you and your child whether they need to sit the OLNA, which is held in March and September each year, starting in Year 10. This means students will have up to six opportunities before the end of Year 12 to meet the requirement.

The OLNA has three components - reading, writing and numeracy. The reading and numeracy components comprise 45 multiple-choice questions; the writing component is an extended response of up to 600 words. Students are allowed 50 minutes for the reading and numeracy components and 60 minutes for the writing.

To prepare our students for the types of questions they can expect and to familiarise themselves with the online assessment platform, we provide access to practice and example tests on a secure website. In addition to providing access to practice tests, we offer a number of specific learning opportunities for students to prepare for the tests.

School grounds

When you next visit the school, please take the time to appreciate our carefully maintained grounds and facilities. Our gardening, cleaning and maintenance staff have worked over the holiday break to prepare our grounds and buildings for the return of staff and students to the new school year.

WAGIN DISTRICT HIGH SCHOOL – INFORMATION TO PROPERTIES AROUND THE SCHOOL SITE REGARDING OUR SCHEDULED BUILDING CONDITION ASSESSMENT

Building Condition Assessments (BCA) are carried out at all schools at regular intervals as part of the Department of Education's overall asset management strategy.

In addition to the inspection of building internals, drones will be used for the first time to provide footage of roof condition and coverings, including penetration points, box gutters and safety anchor points. All of the drone footage will be given to the Department of Finance's Building Management and Works and drones will only be used out of school hours, before 8.00 am and after 4.00 pm weekdays, on weekends or during school holidays.

Drone operators are required to comply with the necessary insurances and certifications including: current Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) certification; and Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (UAV) operator certification.

It is anticipated the BCA inspection of this school will be conducted in due course.

Please therefore do not be alarmed if you see drones flying over the school buildings during this period.



- 7.4 Canteen – T Spooner reported that a canteen committee meeting was held recently as the canteen is currently running at a loss. The committee decided to increase some menu prices in an attempt to rectify the situation. The situation will be assessed towards the end of the term to determine if further changes need to be made. The menu will be updated and attached to a forthcoming Newsletter. T Spooner also reported the need to further research the phone line account, given changes with the NBN.
