# From the Principal

Welcome to Term 2, I hope everyone had a safe, relaxing break. We have started the term with a positive attitude and an action packed schedule. Please keep checking the website regularly as there are many events this term.

### ATTENDANCE

Attendance is a major factor in student achievement, it is very important that we work together to ensure students have 90% or greater attendance. We understand children get sick and families have emergencies that cause absences from school which impact on attendance.

The summary below gives you a snap shot of how attendance impacts on student learning. Please give this careful thought if you are planning family holidays, or any activities that may cause your child's attendance to drop. If they attend 80% for their entire school life they will graduate with 3 years less learning than their peers who attend more than 90%; is this fair?

If a child attends 80% of the time they are in the lowest risk category, but they will miss:

1 day a week 2 weeks a term 8 weeks a year 1 year by the end of Year 4 2 years by the end of Year 8 3 years by the end of Year 12

We will continue to work with families to ensure attendance remains a priority.

### **INTERIM REPORTS YEAR 7 - 10**

Families should have received your child's interim report. The purpose of these is to inform you of your child's progress and the grade they are on track to receive on their semester report later this term. If classroom teachers have requested an interview please make an appointment at your earliest convenience.

### NAPLAN

All students in Year's 3, 5, 7 & 9 across Australia are participating in NAPLAN testing from Tuesday, May 15 to Thursday, May 17. The results from these assessments along with the data teachers collect over the year is used to continually improve our teaching and learning programs. Assessment results will be sent home later this year.

### END OF SEMESTER REPORTS

All students Kindy – Year 10 will receive an official Department of Education report on Monday, June 25. This year we are using the department template for Kindy reports, which our Kindy teachers will explain to parents. # **Primary News**

Welcome to Term 2. I hope you and your family had a restful two week break. Wasn't it much needed after an 11 week term? This term is only 9 weeks and with everything organised to happen so far, it will be over before we know it!

### Literacy Pro Quizzes

As part of our whole school Reading focus, last term saw us revive the Literacy Pro Program in Year 3 - 6 classes. Teachers received professional development from the regional coordinator as to how to maximise use of the Literacy Pro program for progress and achievement and time has been spent guiding students how to use it independently and effectively.

Over the course of the term, we monitored the number of quizzes each class completed (which is done once students have finished reading a book). I'm excited to share that the winning class was Ms Roche's Year 5/6 with a whopping 422 quizzes. Across the 4 classrooms involved, 970 books were read in Term 1. I can't wait to see what our results are for the end of Term 2.

### NAPLAN (National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy)

Next week will see our Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students sit Spelling, Grammar, Writing, Reading and Numeracy NAPLAN tests. If your child is in one of these year levels, we encourage you to treat the testing days as any other. Academic performance is enriched when students have plenty of sleep, a healthy diet and a known support network. Lately, there has been much discussion on radio and the news about NAPLAN that can often cause undue stress and worry. If you notice your child feeling this way, please talk with your class teacher and assure them that them doing their best is all we ask.

### **Book Fair**

From Tuesday, May 22 until Thursday, May 31, we are celebrating Book Fair. The library will be open for parents, students and community members to browse and purchase books before school 8.30 - 8.50am, lunchtimes and after school until 4.00pm. Primary students will be encouraged to partake in a colouring competition where they may win one of many \$5 Book Fair vouchers. All entrants will be displayed in the library over the two week period. We look forward to you coming and supporting the Book Fair. Each sale goes towards the school receiving more books for our students to enjoy.



### National Simultaneous Storytime - NSS

On Wednesday, May 23, (the second day of Book Fair), we will be partaking in the National Simultaneous Storytime where each class will read the same book as other schools across Australia. The book chosen this year is Hickory, Dickory, Dash. To incorporate this with Book Fair, students are encouraged to DRESS UP AS THEIR FA-VOURITE ANIMAL for the day.

We will also have the pleasure of hosting the Wagin Early Years Network NSS event, whereby all parents and community members with children younger than school age are invited to come to listen to a special reading of the story in our school library at 11am. We have a fun morning planned. After the reading, children will enjoy a craft activity, fun animal movement games and morning tea. We look forward to you joining us.

# CYBERBULLYING

## **Tips for Parents**

- Talk to your child about cyberbullying now. Work with your child to develop strategies for dealing with cyberbullying if it happens.
- Identify one or two other trusted adults your child feels comfortable to talk to about cyberbullying.
- Know what your children are doing online. Set filters so they can be safe online.
- Communicate openly with your child. Help your child learn how to interact safely and respectfully online.
- Put the computer in a shared or visible place in the home.
- Talk with your child about which sites are okay to visit. Have clear rules about their online activity.
- Help your child to block anyone who sends offensive content.

## If you think your child is being cyberbullied...

- Talk to them about changes in their mood or behaviour. Help them to stay connected with people they trust.
- Contact the police if you have serious concerns for your child's safety.
- Work to save evidence of the cyberbullying behaviour. It may be needed by the child's school or Internet Service Provider, or by the police.
- Ask the school to explain their processes around cyberbullying.
- Don't ignore the situation. Listen to your child and offer support.
