From the Principal

Welcome back to Term Two, I hope everyone had a safe, relaxing Easter break. We have started the term with a positive attitude and an action packed schedule. Please keep your newsletter handy or check the website regularly as there are many events this term.

ATTENDANCE

Term 1 attendance for the whole school was 89.1%. Primary attendance was 90.55% and Secondary was 82.4%. Our Year 3 students had the best attendance rate during Term 1, 94%, a fantastic effort. This was closely followed by the Year 5s with 93.3%.

Focus 2015, Directions for Schools reiterates the importance of student attendance at school. It is critical for students to attend school regularly to be able to achieve their academic potential. Less than 90% attendance (more than 5 days during a term) puts a student at educational risk. Last term attendance letters were sent to all parents of students who had less than 90% attendance.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT (PBS)

Supporting students to demonstrate positive behaviour continues to be a focus. As parents you are aware that children and young people need direction, support, clear boundaries, respect and good role modeling to behave in a way that is acceptable. At Wagin District High School we are continuing with PBS, many of you know this as EMUS. The purpose of PBS is to support our school to develop an approach based on the underlying principles of decision making guided by data, the establishment of effective school wide routines and consistent responding to behaviour, both positive and negative.

We all need to remember that when a child can't learn we teach, but when a child can't behave do we teach or punish? If we only punish are we supporting that child to learn expected behaviour?

It takes time, a consistent approach and a relentless focus on being positive, supportive role models to every child or young person we have contact with. If we all work together to do this our children and young people will thrive.

INTERIM REPORTS Year 7-10

Families should have received your child's interim report. The purpose of these is to inform you of your child's progress and the grade they are on track to receive on their semester report later this term. If classroom teachers have requested an interview please make an appointment at your earliest convenience.

NAPLAN

All students in Year 3, 5, 7 & 9 across Australia are participating in NAPLAN testing from Tuesday May 12 to Thursday May 14. The results from these assessments along with the data teachers collect over the year is used to continually improve our teaching and learning programs. Assessment results will be sent home later this year.

YEAR 10 CAMP

Our Year 10 students will spend a week in Perth from Tuesday May 12 to Friday May 15, the purpose of this camp is to give them opportunities to explore future career options. They will visit Universities, TAFE campuses and attend the Careers Expo.

Kidsport helps kids join community clubs

KidSport is a program that reduces financial barriers and gets young people participating in community sport.

If your child is excited to join the local football or netball club this year, but you just don't know how you can afford it, why not check if your family is eligible for KidSport assistance?

Is my child eligible?

- Applicants must be aged 5-18 years and have a Health Care Card or Pension Concession Card or be referred by a recognised referral agent.
- Children should live in the shire that they apply for KidSport funding; and preferably register for clubs in the community they live.

Eligible children may access a maximum of \$200 per calendar year, and fees are paid directly to the sporting club by the local government. More than one child per family may apply for the KidSport program if the eligibility criteria are met.
