#### Public School Review

This week Wagin DHS undertook our Public School Review. We are pleased to say that we have been deemed effective. This is a validation from the Department of Education WA that our processes support our new strategic direction. #### Renewal of the Behaviour Management Policy and Procedures

Wagin DHS has introduced to students the updated Good Standing Policy which sits within our school Behaviour Plan. Our Behaviour Management Policy is based on the principles of restorative practice:

- Positive interpersonal relationships are a major influence on behaviour.
- A culture of care supports all individuals in the school community.
- Cultural receptiveness and responsiveness is key to creating learning communities to mutual respect and inclusion.
- A restorative approach leads to individuals taking responsibility for their behaviour.

Our aim at Wagin DHS is to empower students with knowledge about their emotional state and their ability to self-regulate. This has been introduced through our Positive Behaviour Schools (PBS) program in the guise of Zones of Regulation. Positive behaviours are recognised using our EMUS (recognition that students display our values of being Engaged, showing Manners, Understanding and Striving to achieve. <u>Good</u> <u>Standing Policy</u>.

This term we will have a 2 weekly focus for expected good behaviours that will ensure a student maintains their Good Standing (A Good Standing reward will be run Weeks 6 & 9).

Week 1 & 2 – Attendance

Week 3 & 4 - Punctuality

Week 5 & 6 – Behaviour (includes mobile phone use)

Week 7 & 8 – Dress code

We would ask that parents please support the school by having conversations with your children about expectations at school.
