Year 8/9 Visual Art

COURSE OUTLINE

In Visual Arts students will learn through independent and guided opportunities aimed at the refinement of their skills and ability to follow processes required for making art. Students will further explore critical, sensory and emotional ways of representing meaning and ideas as they engage with materials, technologies and processes and explore their own and others' visual arts works.

A greater emphasis on Making and Responding during the year will enable students to develop their knowledge, skills and ability. Students will develop ways to respond critically to their own art and to the artwork of historical and cultural periods and artists.

COURSE OUTCOMES

- Investigate, view, discuss and research, to guide ideas and designs, acknowledging their inspiration.
- Students will demonstrate ways to create and present artworks for an audience viewing and critical reflection.
- Demonstrate necessary manipulative skills to create art and follow appropriate processes required for production.
- Demonstrate understandings of, and use art elements in an effective manner.
- Students will evaluate and respond critically and emotionally to artworks of others and their own given teacher directed frameworks.
- Develop safe, sensible and sustainable work practices when engaging in art making and use of resources, materials and equipment.

TASKS & ASSESSMENT

Task 1: Name: Embossed Aluminium Shields

Inspired by Medieval and the Middle Ages Coat of Arms and Family Shields create your own personal shield that represents you and what is important to you. These will be used as covers for your Art portfolio.









Task 2: Detailed Drawings of The 4 main events of our Farming Calendar:

Use farming images to inspire detailed pen and ink drawings of farming equipment that represent harvest, seeding, shearing and lambing.





Task 3: Show Bag Pop Art: Gouache Painting

Design your own showbag for Woolorama. Use painting, drawing and collage to create a sample show bag. Use the style of POP ART







Task 4: Golden Summers inspired Wall Mural: create felted shapes to stitch onto our whole school wool fibre artwork.

Learn wet felting technique to form shapes that can be added to the felted landscape background. Students will felt either sheep or leave shapes using the wet felting technique.









Task 5: Pop Art Comic Onomatopoeia:

Roy Lichtenstein Drawing and zentangle patterns to create a comic onomatopoeia explosion effect.







Task 6: Fabric soft sculpture:
Oldenburg soft cushions using fabric painting and applique.

Research and explore the works of Roy Lichtenstein and his pop art words. Use lettering skills from previous activity to block in the word then work out from the word creating the illusion of an explosion or a bang! Select either black and white using Zentangle patterns or paint and even collage to create the Roy Lichenstein inspired art works. Complete final product.
