# Phase 4 and 5, Term 3 Changes

With the Phase 4 currently in place, Term 3 will start with the following guidelines: A review will occur once Phase 5 is implemented.

- Parents/carers on site: we are excited that our parents can now join us on site. There are some guidelines to ensure health and hygiene is observed during the winter months.
  - Kiss & drop is still encouraged to foster independence
  - Parent/Teacher meetings are welcomed. Please arrange a meeting with the classroom teacher via email or phoning the front office. This allows uninterrupted time to discuss individual child needs.
  - Parent rosters will be set up in those classes that require the extra individualised guidance. Parents on roster will be asked to sign in at the front office as a Visitor.
  - Assemblies will recommence. The class schedule will be posted early next term. Adult social distancing of 2 square metres should be applied where possible.
  - At this stage we will be asking parents not to enter classes in the morning unless you are
    on roster or specifically requested by the teacher. Teaching & Learning opportunities often
    starts before 8.50am.
- Cleaning regime will continue in Term 3. The Education Department has funded for ongoing additional cleaning throughout Term 3. Benches, chairs, doorhandles and playground equipment will be cleaned multiple times a day.

- · Incursions and excursions can occur.
- · Interschool sports can occur. Parents should maintain physical distancing of two square metres.

#### Reports

Semester One Reports will be emailed home on **Thursday**, **2 July**. A reminder that due to a break in traditional schooling as a result of COVID, the reporting structure will not be as comprehensive as normal. Please note, A-E grades will only be shown for Year 10 students. Attributes, behaviour and effort will be indicated as well as comments outlining your child's strengths and areas for improvement. This applies to all public schools in WA.

Please ensure you contact the school immediately if your email address has changed. A reminder that electronic reports will only be available for 1 month. Please be sure to download and save for further reference.
